## JACKPOT ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES

**THURSDAY, June 7, 2022**

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### **6:00 P.M. CALL TO ORDER:**

The meeting of the Jackpot Advisory Board was called to order by Chairperson Teresa Hugill at 6:00 pm mountain standard time on June 7, 2022, in meeting room of the Jackpot Senior Center Building, Jackpot, Nevada.

### **INSTRUCTIONS TO THE GALLERY:**

Chairperson Teresa Hugill advised the public to step to the front of the room to identify themselves and to speak clearly for the record. He stated that they should try and not speak out of turn or among themselves. If anybody has a cell phone it should be muted and if a call needs to be answered, it must be taken outside.

## **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

Chairperson Teresa Hugill led the pledge of allegiance.

## **COMMENTS BY THE GENERAL PUBLIC:**

Pursuant to N.R.S. 241.020, 2 (c) (3), this time is devoted to comments by the general public, if any, and discussion of those comments. No action may be taken upon a matter raised during a period devoted to comments by the general public until the matter itself has been specifically included on a successive agenda and identified to be an action item.

Brad Hester (Jackpot Fireworks) stated that the Fourth of July fireworks have been ordered. He mentioned that other places may not get their fireworks because they weren't ordered in time. He stated that the first part in July he will be ordering the Christmas fireworks. The people who help him with the fireworks have their licenses and there was a communication issue with one person, but it's all resolved now. The fireworks will be at 10:20pm.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) asked if there were any contributions from the town. Mr. Hester stated that there haven't been any for years, Robin Barton (Barton's Club 93) has given him some funds, but in the last several years nobody else has. The town covers the cost.

## **TOWN OF JACKPOT**

- a. Raft River Electric Company update of the electrical service provided to the town of Jackpot.

Mike Christensen (Raft River Rural Electric) stated that during the planned outage a couple weeks ago with Idaho Power, Raft River worked on the fuses that blow out towards Middlestack after the power returns. They also updated other equipment and increased the size of the fuse to try and make sure it doesn't blow out. They feel pretty good about it, but wintertime will be when they will know if it worked.

He mentioned that the people that helped with the community clean up and cooked burgers felt like it was well attended by the community. They were surprised. Chairperson Teresa Hugill commented that they were surprised to see all those in attendance. Mr. Christensen apologized for being absent, but he was out of town. The group that participated would like to do it again. He mentioned that several years ago Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) asked him to do a safety demo for Cactus Petes. He would like to be able to do that safety demo at the next cleanup day. Chairperson Hugill stated that she thinks it would be neat for the children to see. Mr. Christensen commented that they also thought of setting up a table with magnets, things with Raft River's number, and items that they use during their annual meeting since it's hard for people to attend.

Vice-Chairman Shawn Mathis commented that they may be able to get Raft River a free booth at the car show if they are interested. The car show is August 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. This is the next event in the town aside from the Fourth of July.

Mr. Christensen mentioned that in the future they are planning to move a line across the road where the new Love's will be and there needs to be an outage.

They are tentatively thinking June 28<sup>th</sup> (Tuesday), it would be about three to four hours. It will be from Cactus Petes South and the East side of the road. It will be the school, post office, and recreation center. The board agreed that early in the morning would be better for the outage. Mr. Christensen commented that Raft River would be calling all their members to inform them of the outage.

Chairperson Hugill thanked Raft River for their attendance at the cleanup day and the BBQ. They are appreciated.

b. Nevada Health Center update.

Kerrie Preston (Jackpot Clinic Practice Manager) stated that she didn't have any new updates. There are covid vaccines available even though the need may be less.

Vice-Chair Shawn Mathis asked about the status of rapid tests? Mrs. Preston stated that she hasn't been able to get them and covid is increasing again. She will be contacting Dr. Putnam regarding the tests. Once she knows she will contact the town clerk to update her, the clerk can then relay the message. She knows it's hard having to send the PCR tests and waiting days for the results. She will look into getting the rapid tests and will follow-up with any new information.

c. Discussion and consideration to approve the expenditure of \$20,000.00 dollars for the town match for the community bus from the town contingency fund.

**ACTION ITEM**

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) stated that the above item is no longer an action item because there was a bus lined out, but there needed to be approval from the Advisory Board and the County Commissioners. The bus ended up being sold in this process, in order to bypass this the County Commissioners approved a new bus last week. He would just like to make the Advisory Board aware of this. The town match can be up to twenty thousand dollars.

It's a brand new bus and it can fit fourteen passengers. He commented that if there is anybody interested in a part-time job to drive the bus once schedules are figured out. There will be trips to Twin Falls for doctor appointments and food shopping. He needs for the person to be competent and dependable. A regular driver's license will suffice, a CDL is required after twenty-one passengers. He commented that everything has been approved and the bus has been ordered. This is part of a grant with Abigail Wheeler from the Transit Department in Elko County. Mr. Burt mentioned that at the Elko County Commissioners meeting they ended up buying three buses at the same time and Jackpot gets one.

This action item was dismissed.

d. Discussion and consideration to approve the Golf Professional Agreement between the County of Elko, Nevada, and Brent Fleshman.

**ACTION ITEM**

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) stated that the county asked Brent Fleshman (Golf Course) for his books two years ago. Amanda Osbourne (County Manager), Rand Greenburg (Elko County Lawyer) and himself looked over it.

The verbiage changes that were made were: increase his portion of what he has to maintain and to keep the equipment if under warranty, warranted.

One of the reasons that the verbiage was left the same in going over his books is because Brent has done a wonderful job at the golf course since he's been operating it. He does draw a lot of people into the golf course and he's a benefit to the town. The lease is for five years and if approved today on the following Wednesday when the commissioners are in town, they will approve it also and sign it.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) commented that on section 4.8 "Infrastructure and equipment improvements shall be the responsibility of the county" is this the county of Elko or the town of Jackpot. Mr. Burt stated that it's the town of Jackpot.

The two big projects that will be worked on at the golf course include the sidewalk and concrete that have lifted because of the roots. These areas have been grinded throughout the years. The asphalt where the cars go around will also be repaved and replaced. Brent Fleshman (Jackpot Golf Course) commented that they are worried about somebody tripping and having them go after everybody. Mr. Burt stated that it's a liability. Those are the two big projects that fall under the town and Mr. Fleshman will need to replace light ballasts and upkeep up to a certain dollar amount and everything after that the town will need to care of it.

Mr. Ririe asked about the sprinkler project because the dredging had started, and he wanted to know if this something that is still being worked on. Mr. Burt stated that he's still working on it and is filing with a storm drain water conservation grant, if the grant is awarded the remaining of the balance will be covered which at that time was two million dollars. Mr. Fleshman commented that the main parts were done, dredging of the lake, relining it, and a new pump station. This helped tremendously and the stuff in the ground is thirty to forty years old so it's a constant replacing job.

Mr. Burt mentioned that with old system and with the stuff that has been done already it's less wear and hard-hitting on the system. This year he has found NDEP funding and if the town gets it, it will be a forgiven loan. This is what he's going for in order to finish the irrigation project at the golf course.

Mr. Fleshman commented that this is his seventeenth year and there has been a lot of good and bad. He's looking forward to it being more good. It's been an exciting trip and he would like to see it through a bit longer. He hopes he will be able to retire from Jackpot Golf Club. He hopes that now that covid has lessened the golf course will be able to recuperate because although he received PPP loans, he also took out loans to not skimp on fertilizer or pesticides. There are also other bills like the electric bill that is needed to keep the building operating. They are noticing a lot of interest especially since the town is growing.

Brad Hester (Jackpot resident) mentioned that having been on the board when Mr. Fleshman was hired and living in Jackpot for thirty-two years it's a night a day difference from before and after Mr. Fleshman. It's not the same place business wise, condition wise, and equipment wise. Before Mr. Fleshman the golf course wasn't busy.

- e. Discussion and consideration to approve a concrete barrier.

**ACTION ITEM**

Chairperson Teresa Hugill stated that this item is dissolved, and no action would be taken.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) commented that he and Stormi McCarthy (Jackpot Combined School) had a long conversation and came to an understanding with an issue that arose throughout town for the last couple of weeks. Everybody is moving forward and in the future before school starts the school will be asking for assistance towards surveillance equipment to help protect the children.

The concrete barrier item was added by Mrs. McCarthy before some information was given out. It won't be a chain-link fence with slats, it's a solid vinyl wall fence. This information is from engineering, and it will be a better privacy fence. He commented that there is also a storm drain collection in that area. The narrowest part is three feet wide and it's all three feet deep.

Monica Burt (Jackpot Advisory Board member) asked how tall the fence would be.

Mr. Burt stated that he wasn't sure, but he thinks that from the original civil engineer plans it included a six foot tall fence. He mentioned that the town included that they would like to see a stone wall, concrete wall, or brick wall in the non-conditional use permit, but it's private property and the town can't make them do it, regardless of this the company will be adding something more than a chain link fence.

1. Golf Course operations update.

**NON ACTION ITEM**

Brent Fleshman (Jackpot Golf Club) stated he tries to do a written report every month when he can't attend the meetings due to education meetings. The Spring has been tough. In the last thirty days the golf course hosted the Idaho State Golf Association Championship. This happens once every five years. It includes the best players in Idaho and some from Northern Nevada, the golf course is part of their association. It was a good tournament. The golf course will be hosting the Idaho State Junior Championship, boy and girls ages 9-17 that Thursday. There are parents who arrive the day prior and spend the night to give their child a practice run.

He mentioned that just like other businesses they are having trouble with their seasonal employees. The regular employees are still around, and they are doing their best to have a full staff. He commented that during the summer is when most of the tournaments start and he mentioned that there were two moose on the course, and he hopes that they have moved on. The course is in fantastic shape.

Chairperson Teresa Hugill asked how disc golf would interrupt his thigs. Mr. Fleshman commented that he and Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) have talked, but they have worked on the plan of where it will be going. He doesn't think it will disrupt anything as long as it's planned when there aren't many people out there. He thinks it will be fun and another activity for people. He mentioned that at Canyon Springs in Twin Falls they run the disc golf alongside the golf course and give people tee times to rent cars and play along with the golfers. This isn't done every day. It's once every three weeks and it's successful.

Mr. Burt stated that in the following weeks they will be having the disc golf people look at the golf course because in July they will be purchasing an additional twelve holes. There are six installed now. Mr. Fleshman commented that the parks, basketball court, and adding more things to do will continue to make it look neat.

## **JACKPOT TOURISM NON ACTION ITEM**

1. Tourism's operations update.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) stated there will be reconstructing within tourism. At this time the plans that are in effect will continue.

2. Social Media Manager update.

Mackenna Ririe (Social Media Manager) was absent, no report given.

## **JACKPOT'S HELPING HANDS FOOD BANK & SERVICES**

1. Jackpot's Helping Hands Food Bank and Services update.  
**NON ACTION ITEM**

Theresa Dimmitt (CEO Jackpot's Helping Hands /Food Pantry & Senior Services) stated that the Food Pantry is going strong. The shelves may look empty however, the freezers are full. Mrs. Dimmitt commented that the Food Pantry is receiving another food delivery tomorrow. She thanked the Public Work guys who go to pick up the food from Wells, NV twice a month and they unload it at the Food Pantry, they are amazing, and all their hard work is greatly appreciated.

The Clothes Closet has been blessed with a lot of donations. More donations than they have space. Mrs. Dimmitt thinks that one of the reasons people are not picking up the clothes is because they don't know that the clothes closet is here. She is going to have a "Free Day/Open house to let people come in to look around and pick up clothes from the clothes closet. She will be doing a fundraiser for the non-profit at the M.M.A.S.V. Street Races this summer and plans on selling water, hot dogs, and other items for at least 7 of these events.

Mrs. Dimmitt asked if anyone willing and able to donate a case of water or baked goods to Helping Hands it would be greatly appreciated. The more items donated the more it will benefit the non-profit. Mrs. Dimmitt asked Brent Fleshman if he will be keeping the Golf Course open during the races? Mr. Fleshman responded that he will only be keeping it open until 7PM, unless they are busy with people buying food items. Mr. Fleshman commented that they only had a few people buy items last weekend and about 50 people used the facilities. Mrs. Dimmitt suggested that they bring in port-a-potty.

## **JACKPOT SENIOR CENTER**

### **2. Senior Center operations update.**

Bill Dimmitt (Jackpot Senior Center) asked if anyone has seen the new Newsletter? Mr. Dimmitt explained that for marketing reasons Senior Center is referred as the 55+ Club. He explained that it's a marketing strategy to let people know this is a fun place to visit.

Mr. Dimmitt mentioned that there has been an increase in participation, food is being served at the events and starting today they started playing Loteria Mexican Bingo with Taco Tuesday.

He commented that there is an increase in volunteers and that there is a new security system for the safety of the volunteers and those that visit the center.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) asked if food is being served? Mrs. Dimmitt answered that the Helping Hands program provides the meals. Helping Hands provides meals at every event. For example, today was Taco Tuesday, tomorrow they will make meatball subs.

Chairperson Teresa Hugill asked if he still needed help? Mr. Dimmitt replied yes, Chairperson Hugill asked Mr. Ririe if he had anyone that would be interested? Mr. Ririe confirmed he does have a few that may be interested. Mrs. Dimmitt asked Mr. Ririe if he was talking about the students from the Church? Mr. Ririe said yes, but he also has a young men and woman's group. Mrs. Dimmitt stated that one of the requirements for the Senior Center to be nationally recognized is that intergenerational activities are included. She mentioned that someone donated a lot of craft items, and a program with crafts including the seniors and the volunteers under the age of 55.

## **JACKPOT EVENTS**

### **3. Event operations update.**

Tara Norris (Jackpot Events Coordinator) stated she just completed her first Jackpot Pride event, it was a success, Raft River was impressed, there was a large turnout in students and community members. It will be done again next year.

The next event is 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Ms. She will have the flyer out for the Advisory Board approval soon. Ms. Norris commented that she is only doing the town event items. She doesn't know who is doing the Jackpot Jam Flyer or any others. Theresa Dimmitt mentioned that she has talked to Larry Lineberry and wanted to confirm the time the afternoon picnic will be over, so that vendors can setup at the park. Chairperson Hugill agreed that 4:00PM would be a good time to tell vendors.

Mr. Burt asked about the flyers for the races the following weekend. Ms. Norris said that she took the dates of the races that Mr. Horn sent her, she prettied it up and posted them around town.

## **JACKPOT RECREATION CENTER**

- A. Recreation Department operations update.  
**NON ACTION ITEM**

Beth Lamb (Jackpot Aquatic Center) was absent, Lindsey Merryman stated that things are going well, they are fully staffed and trained. People are using the pool and working out, so they are keeping busy. Monica Burt (Jackpot Advisory Board member) asked if they have things set up for the summer programs? Mrs. Merryman said not yet, so far, they have been working on staffing and training. Chairman Hugill asked if Mrs. Merryman is Beth Lamb's assistant or what her position is? Mrs. Merryman said she is the lead lifeguard. Although, she isn't a lifeguard. Mr. Ririe asked how many people are coming in and using the Recreation Center? Mrs. Merryman answered it depends on the day, they are currently getting about 20-25 people in a day. Ms. Hugill asked if they sign in the water aerobics people on the log? Mrs. Merryman replied yes, they do.

## **JACKPOT PUBLIC WORKS**

- 1. Public Works water, sewer, landfill, streets, and operations update.

Gustavo Estrada (Jackpot Public Works) stated that they cracked sealed Gurley Drive. Mr. Estrada commented they ran out of crack seal so they will have to wait until July to buy more sealer. They have sprayed for weeds around the parks and Recreation Center for Dandelions. Chairperson Hugill asked if there is a charge to people to rent the park area to pay Mr. Estrada's team to clean up the park? He mentioned that they jetted from Piersanti all the way to Gurley. That is cleaned now, water was jetted through, and a camera was also put through the sewer Mr. Estrada explained Maria Salas, the Town Clerk collects a \$200.00 deposit. Once they confirm the park was left clean, they get their deposit back. However, if people use the park and don't reserve it then we have no way of tracking that.

## **JACKPOT SAFETY / FIRE**

- 1. **Jackpot Ambulance**
  - a. Jackpot Ambulance operations update.

Shelly Hester (Jackpot ambulance) stated that since she didn't give the report last month. For the month of April there were a total of thirty-eight Ambulance calls twenty of which were transports. Mrs. Hester commented that they have been doing multiple calls on the weekend. As many as five or six calls. For the month of May, Mrs. Hester reported that they had twenty-eight calls and twelve of them were transports. She mentioned that this time Ambulance one and Ambulance two were out at the same time due to the increase in calls.

Chairperson Hugill asked if a plan is needed as the town grows to have more EMTs and Fire Crew?

Chief Brian Hugill responded yes, absolutely; in the last month they had combined Fifty-Five calls.

## **2. Jackpot Fire Department**

### **a. Jackpot Fire Department operations update.**

Brian Hugill (Jackpot Fire Chief) stated that they received a new Fire Apparatus to replace the one that was lost, from Elko County Fire. It is a large truck, it is an international 7400 4X4, it is parked out in front if anyone would like to go out and see it.

He mentioned that they are getting ready to revamp and revise the SOG (Standing Operating Guidelines and the SOP (Standard Operating Procedures). Chairperson Hugill asked if the truck belongs to Jackpot, Chief Hugill replied yes, and the paperwork needs to be done through Elko County.

Bruce Ririe (Jackpot Advisory Board member) asked if they were planning on doing any controlled burns? Chief Hugill replied as soon as things start to dry out a little it is to green now. Mr. Ririe said that when people ask about burning, he tells them to contact the fire department “now”. Chief Hugill said they are doing burn permits.

## **Elko County Sheriff’s Department**

### **a. Sheriff Office operations update.**

Aitor Narvazia (Elko County Sheriff) stated that they are working with Utah on a missing person case. Sheriff Narvaiza commented they are also working on a missing person near Curry, they have almost two-thousand hours in and unfortunately, they still have not found him

Sheriff Narvaiza mentioned they purchased 24 new trucks this year for staff, the Sheriff’s Department spent one-hundred-seventy-five thousand dollars on MDT Mobil Data Computers for the vehicles. They doubled up on their training and they will get new protective vests in July.

They have one detective position, an operator, one animal control, and another position in Wendover which will start in July. He mentioned that traffic calls and arrests have been going up as the casinos get busier.

Chairperson Hugill asked if the town could request a couple more deputies as it grows? Sheriff Narvaiza said yes, and they can look at that. Chairperson Hugill stated that there isn’t always a deputy in town, but she understands that they are on vacation or on a call. Sheriff Narvaiza responded that there should always be a deputy all the time. If one is busy on a call the other is on call and will be called out. Each deputy is required to be in the town twelve hours on call prior to their shift. They are being paid to be in the town, if they are being paid and aren’t in the town then that is an issue, a big issue for sure.

Monica Burt (Jackpot Advisory Board member) asked once the Loves Truck Stop comes in would it be possible to have a deputy out by the school in the morning and after school when the students are walking to and from school?

Sheriff Narvaiza said yes that shouldn't be a problem at those times. He doesn't think the Loves Truck Stop will cause more issues in town. They have several new stations in Elko and the only problem they have seen is a few transients hanging around. If there are transients hanging around the Loves the deputies can be called to have them trespassed from the property.

Deputy Sevier asked about Edge Fest and races, Sheriff Narvaiza commented that the Edge Fest security is not bonded to work in the state of Nevada, they asked if the Elko County Sheriffs would do the security for them to which he said no. It isn't their job to work inside the event, they will have extra deputies on duty at that time however, not to work the event.

Shawn Burt (Jackpot Public Works Superintendent) asked if it would be better if the town gave Sheriff Narvaiza an itinerary for the summer? Sheriff Narvaiza replied yes, he mentioned that Deputy Andrew has gotten together with Cactus Petes, and West Wendover to get things figured out.

Sheriff Narvaiza mentioned that he will be out of the Country next month and the people to contact are Lieutenant Fisher or Justin Aims. Chairperson Hugill asked if it would be beneficial to email him or to get with his guys here? He stated that she could get with one of deputies in town, send him an email, or call. Chairperson Hugill commented that the races Deputy Sevier was talking about are the Street Races that will be going on over the next few months. Sheriff Narvaiza asked her to email him a schedule.

Mr. Burt mentioned he called Deputy Holiday last week, regarding the off-road vehicles. The ordinance is 15 MPH, there was a whole group come in off the Y3 Ranch, they blew right through the ranch and through town. The problem was Deputy Holiday was in Wells responding to something else and there was nobody in the town. Mr. Burt asked when they see these off-road vehicles to please stop them. Deputy Sevier commented that he has been hitting traffic stops hard, in the last two days he has done 65 traffic stops and has written 30 tickets. He said he isn't sure if anyone has noticed but he has been sitting on the East side of the road, north of the light and all-day people come through at 65 miles per hour and he stops them, but he can only stop one at a time.

Chairman Hugill said she sees him all the time, Vice-Chair Shawn Mathis commented that as the Deputy said he is only one person. There needs to be more than one deputy here especially if one is called out to Wells. Where is the backup in town? Deputy Sevier stated that the backup is on call asleep waiting for his shift. Vice-Chair Mathis said if he saw the dilemma? Deputy Sevier stated yes, but until they can hire more staff this all they can do. Vice-Chair Mathis agreed and said he understood. Mr. Burt mentioned they are doing a good job presenting themselves, they are seen a lot more than before, and it's appreciated.

1. Discussion and consideration of received correspondence.

Alex Torrero (Jackpot Advisory Board member) read an email sent from William Payne (Thrive Store manager) explaining that he couldn't make it to the meeting, but he wanted them to know that he was finally able to get a landscaping crew licensed in Nevada to work on the store's landscaping. The company started working on June 7, 2022 and will be done with it within the week. He apologized for the delay in having it done.

Chairperson Hugill stated that she asked him to start getting the property taken care of, especially if other places have also been aware of maintaining their areas, plus this was part of their agreement to keep the area beautiful.
